


The 2010 AGM of the Violet Needham Society

Please be aware that parking in the area is limited to four hours' maximum (pay by phone) or by residents' permit; in other words, virtually unobtainable.

Travel Directions:

From Baker Street tube station

(Bakerloo, Jubilee, Circle, Metropolitan, and Hammersmith and City Lines)
Walk south down Baker Street for a third of a mile, and turn left into Robert Adam Street. St. Paul's is on your left. (10 mins walk)

Bond Street tube station (Central and Jubilee lines)

Walk west along Oxford Street and turn right into Duke Street. Cross Wigmore Street and continue up Duke Street to Manchester Square. Cross Manchester Square to Manchester Street, and take the first left, which is Robert Adam Street. St. Paul's is on your right. (6 mins walk)

Buses 2, 13, 30, 74, 82, 113, 139, 189 & 274 run down Baker Street from the north and up Gloucester Place (parallel, one block to the west) from the south.
